When Tier 6 appears – and it will very soon – you will be missing out on lots of \$\$\$. If you began under a lower Tier, you can "buy back" into it. Folks, if you plan on being in a profession that allows you to continue to Lifeguard, you want in the system. <u>In-House Training of Officers</u>: This cooperative effort between local Human Resources and the JBLC initially started with Captains

and has now been extended to Lieutenants and Boatswains. More information and scheduling are forthcoming.

Service Awards: Traditionally, lifeguards who have made it to 50 years of service (hey Rookies, can you even grasp that?) as well as those who have "moved on" yet while they were on the stand (because they'll always be members of the Corps) their performance was legendary, are lauded for their efforts. We will be recognizing these Lifeguard Legends this summer at the Annual Union Party. Can you guess who they are?



Remember, all JBLC members must be certified in CPR/AED for the Professional Rescuer or American Heart Association equivalent each year. The JBLC offers sessions to recertify in pay status. You must hold a current certificate to attend one of these sessions. This year the ARC has made several changes to past procedures; all course records are now submitted online, a new database system is in place (if your current card has a 7/11/11 or later expiration date-you can attend one of these classes, if not you must get recertified on your own), the course materials have been updated, and the cost has gone up from \$15 to \$25.

#### To be recertified you must attend one of the 5 classes and:

- Have a current American Red Cross or equivalent CPR/AED Pro card (dated 7/11/11 or later)
- Park in a marked parking spot
- Bring \$25 cash
- Arrive in time to sign-in (print name on payroll sheet), pay, and fill out information sheet
- All classes will start at 7:15 and end at 10:15
- Be present for the video/lecture
- Take and pass the written test
- Perform all skills with minimal assistance from instructors
- Get signature from instructor at each skill station
- Check out with head instructor (make sure payroll sheet, information sheet, and skill sheet are accurate and complete)

I make no apologies for being so fanatical about safety – for lifeguards and patrons. Whether it is the weight of the wingstands or the durability of the rescue lines, it is vitally important that the JBLC continue to refine or replace our existing equipment. For instance, the white foam rescue buoys that we have used for many decades might become a thing of the past.

For many years, the white foam logs used to make our buoys were coated <u>with an outer skin finish</u> which prevented the foam from absorbing water. This is no longer the case: The prior foam log manufacturer was acquired by a national company which now requires a very large custom order, whose size is not economically feasible.

Working with an equipment manufacturer, an alternative has been designed using modern materials and features suited to the Corps' needs. The newly designed Inflatable Rescue Buoy (IRB) should be more effective because it (a) has twice the buoyancy of the white foam buoy with the same dimensions; (b) offers better hydrodynamics in heavy surf conditions; (c) is made with heavy duty Coast Guard approved materials with military-quality stitching; and (d) requires less storage space needed when deflated.

As far as durability, you should know that the Navy SEALs use inflatable vests of lighter weight material than the IRB. Even more, life rafts are made of a similar inflatable material and survive extreme surf and weather conditions. Worried that the IRB will blow away in the wind? No need to; the physical weight is identical to the white foam buoy when dry.

Please give the new buoy a try, especially on one of those big surf days which always seem to want to rip the old school buoy off your body; use it during your "average" rescue too. In both cases, please email me with your feedback.
